

HISTORY OF BERWICK

This article is based on information found in the following: HISTORY OF BERWICK, by Milo Bryn; A Column in the MINOT DAILY NEWS, by Leonard Lund; Early Editions or issues of THE BERWICK POST.

Also letters from or interviews with those who were in a position to know Berwick in the early years of its' existence.

"A happy home. Have one of your own in Berwick, the new town in eastern McHenry County on the main line of the Great Northern Railway, offers the best of opportunities in the west for all classes of business. Berwick is situated in the best flax growing country in the world. Finest No. 1 hard wheat land. Splendid horse, cattle, and sheep country and plenty of nutritious grass. The surrounding country is settled by live, energetic, prosperous farmers--many of them are well to do. If you want to leave an old place and come to a brand new town--come now before all the best locations are taken. For prices or further information, call on or write to E.E. Greene, Townsite owner, Berwick, N.D."

This ad, wrote Milo Bryn in his HISTORY OF BERWICK, was taken from "THE BERWICK POST", June issue, 1901. The Great Northern Railroad had extended its line from Devils Lake to four miles west of Minot. The first permanent building on the Berwick townsite was the section house built in 1897. Thirty years later it was sold to Jack Haman who moved it to his farm.

Elmer E. Greene bought the townsite property of Berwick from Henry Erickson of Towner in April, 1899 for \$800.00 and in the June 1901 issue of "The Berwick Post" the above ad appeared. The settlement of Berwick had already begun. Pat Morrissey constructed the first elevator. Mary Baldwin, who later married Pat Morrissey, erected her general store in Berwick. A St. Hilaire Lumber Co. was established. Elmer Greene and Ole Gilbertson built their hardware store.

The ad brought results. Only a matter of months before the Berwick State Bank was opened with A.M. Iverson, president; T.N. Fylken, vice president; and Ed Nelson, cashier. This bank building was on the opposite side of the street from where the town hall now stands. In 1904 the bank had a paid up capital of \$10,000. The building itself cost \$4000.00 to erect.

George Jundt and Nels Jacobson built a general store across the street from the Morrissey elevator. The building was later bought by Frank Sitter and moved to the corner by the Highway.

In 1906 a creamery was established with stockholders being: Iver Orvedal, T.N. Fylken, O.A. Rue, M.A. Halseth, Thor Teigen, George Jundt, Ole Bryn, Louis Ebel, and Hans Fedje. It was built on a corner of Ole Tweeten's property, on what now belongs to John and Mary Volk. Creamery must have folded after 1907.

An A.K. Lee erected a building in Berwick which he used as a store for five years. One morning in February, his clerk, John Stauss, found the store locked when he came to work. Upon opening the store and entering the back room, he found Mr. Lee frozen to death.

In 1906, Chris Fedje and Nels Tweet purchased the Lee store. Later Tweet opened a store in Tunbridge and Mr. Fedje continued to operate the store alone until he was killed when struck by a train in 1933. Mrs. Fedje operated the store from then on until it was destroyed by fire in 1942.

Elmer Greene sold his store to M.A. Halseth of Cando in 1902. Mr. Halseth continued to operate it as a grocery store until he moved to Minot.

Martin Oppen built a store in 1907, the first of the famous line of Oppen's Grocery Stores, 8 in North Dakota and 1 in California. In 1923, he sold it to Peter Johner and Casper Johner. Pete Johner died in 1930 and Casper sold his share to Elmer Halseth. The store was now known as Johner and Halseth. After the building burned, Elmer bought and moved in a store from Barton. He continued here with the grocery line until he closed the store in 1965 and retired.

Martin Oppen and Oscar Hilmen built a hardware store in 1902. Later, Oppen sold to the Arnold Bros. Then Hilmen bought out Arnold and continued to operate the store until he died in 1959.

Thorvald Fylken built a hardware store in 1906 (south of Hilmen's store) and operated this store until 1915. This building also housed the Knoll Drugstore but was destroyed by fire in 1915. Knoll then moved his drug business across the street to the former Berwick State Bank building.

Louis Ebel built an Implement Shop in 1902. In 1910 he sold it to Otto Aubol, and Ole Bryn. Aubol sold to Pete Teigen. After a few years operation, the building was sold to Oscar Hilmen who moved it to his farm south of Berwick.

There was also another implement firm under the name of Rasmus Folden and Henry Erickson. Years later this business was operated by Nick Schafer, Charlie Knudson, and Ole Bryn. Mr. Schafer bought out his partners. Years later it was sold to Jack Haman who moved it to his farm and used it as a barn.

It seems there used to be three lumber yards. The first one was St. Hilaire Retail Lumber Co. which later became the Imperial Lumber Co. Then there was the Atlas Lumber Co. which was sold to Ole Torgerson in 1910. Torgerson owned about five lumber yards, four of them in neighboring towns.

The Citizens State Bank was organized in 1906 by Henry Paul, C.D. Rice, Louis Ebel, and A.A. Hanson with Louis Ebel as cashier. They built a brick building which is still standing. Two years later this bank sold out to the Berwick State Bank which then moved into the brick building. In 1934 Berwick State Bank sold to the Citizens State Bank of Rugby.

Did you know that at one time there were six elevators operating in Berwick? Some say there were seven. There was the Heising Elevator which later became the St. Anthony & Dakota, the Acme Elevator, Berwick Farmers Elevator, Arnold Bros. Elevator, Foss Elevator, and the Morrissey Elevator. Most of them burned or were moved away so only part of one remains today and that is owned by Warner Knudson but is not open for business. Berwick had a large area to draw from for its' grain market--extending south for forty miles. Often one could see 30 to 40 wagonloads in line waiting to get into the elevators. Construction by the Soo Line Railway of a railroad about twenty miles south of Berwick cut deeply into this market.

Several doctors lived in Berwick but outside of Dr. Steeves who came to Berwick in 1905 and stayed until 1915, the periods of stay by the others were brief. Dr. Nap Chagnon came in 1902. Dr. Phelps was there in 1904 but left before Dr. Steeves arrived.

There probably was need for a doctor once in a while at least, as Berwick had some wild times too in those early years--gambling, bootlegging, and fights over a keg of beer.

Quoting from Milo Bryn's account: "This is taken from TOWNER NEWS AND STOCKMAN".

'A little shooting affray at Berwick on Wednesday between J. Gallagher, a merchant, and Wm. Mitchell, foreman for the BERWICK POST, resulted luckily in nobody getting hurt. The difficulty arose over the possession of a room in the rear of the printing office which Gallagher claimed he had rented. It resulted in Mitchell slapping Gallagher when the latter drew his gun and fired three shots, one shot lodging in the heel of Mitchell's shoe. Mitchell then ran to the printing office and produced his own gun and fired at Gallagher's retreating figure. The report states he was wounded in the side, as Mrs. Gallagher produced a 38 calibre bullet she claims was extracted from his side, but it was generally known that Mitchell used a 45 calibre."

Then under "Local Happenings" in an April issue published in 1905 of THE BERWICK POST (courtesy of Claude Oppen) was this item:

"Several blind piggers came to grief at Granville on Saturday".

Seems like these incidents created excitement but no serious injury--just a part of Berwick's early history.

The two religions that most of the early Berwick pioneers belonged to were Lutheranism and Roman Catholicism. A Roman Catholic Church was never built at Berwick. There were times during the winter when Mass would be held in the Morrissey store but most Catholics would go to either Towner or Rugby.

Two Lutheran congregations, however, did build in Berwick. One was the Berwick Lutheran Free Church and the other was Trinity Lutheran Church. (Information here was taken from the Golden Jubilee edition of the PIERCE COUNTY TRIBUNE, June 18, 1936, Courtesy of Mrs. Elaine Kraft).

The Berwick Lutheran Free Church congregation was organized by Rev. G.U. Peterson who served from Minot. Services were held in any place convenient. In 1900 the congregation decided to build their own church and it was completed in 1902. In 1940 the structure was raised from its foundation and a basement was constructed. The Ladies' Aid was organized around 1900.

Early officers of the church were: Ole Rue, Elias Larson, Ole Bryn, Christian Hageseth, Ole Hanson, Lauritz Larvick, M.T. Aubol, Herman Haugen, Evan Rue and Ole Hjelje.

It is presently being served by Pastor Gerald C. White from Rugby. Its' membership is very active in all departments of the church.

Trinity Lutheran Church congregation was organized in 1899 by Rev. O.L. Brevig of Leeds. It was sometimes called the Valders Lutheran congregation as so many of its members were from Valders, Wisconsin.

Charter members of the church were: Martin Oppen, Ole Torgerson, Tom Oppen, Oscar Hilmen, Ed Fylken and Chris Fedje.

The church building was started in 1910 but was not completed until 1932.

Rev. R.T. Wanberg from Towner took charge as pastor in 1919 and continued to serve until the church was disbanded in 1973.

Although the members were few in number, they were a lively group and supported many activities such as Sunday School, Ladies' Aid, and Luther League. The annual Lutefisk Suppers served by the men of the congregation were well attended by people from far and wide.

Mail was first delivered to the Berwick community about 1885. The mail was sent from Devils Lake (end of railroad at that time) to Minnewaukan by steam-

boat. From here it was picked up by carrier who had a fast team of horses. The mail for Berwick was left at Newport (southwest of Towner) and was taken to the Hans Oium farm (north of Towner). The early settlers would go to the Oium farm and pick up their mail.

The first post office for Berwick was established in Jan., 1900 with Elmer Greene as postmaster and the office was in his store. Before that, however, mail for Berwick was dropped off at the James Cock's sod house which was on the Berwick townsite. This was in 1890 and lasted 3 years. The last postmaster for Berwick was Mrs. Eileen Ebell. Mail for Berwick is now handled by rural delivery from Towner.

THE BERWICK POST, edited by A.C. Sleight, sent out its first issue in June., 1901. Other publishers were Richard Leppla and H.R. Young. The subscription rate was \$1.50 per year and it was published every Saturday at Berwick. At one time the paper had over 400 subscribers.

Martin Evenson was a barber in Berwick for many years. He had his barber shop in a building next to one of the two hotels that were run by Otto Finneman. Mr. Evenson later moved to Minot.

Ed Larson was a blacksmith in Berwick for quite a few years. He later moved to a farm north of Berwick.

Can you believe that Berwick also had an 18 piece town band? It did and in the band were: Herb Arnold playing violin, Lyle Arnold (son) playing a horn, Madge Arnold (daughter) playing piano, Casper Johner and Walter Ebell, slide trombone.

In latter years the Berwick community plays were well received and attracted a lot of people.


Time is gradually erasing Berwick -- not many are left. The town that once boasted it had 6 grain elevators, 2 banks, 2 hotels, 3 lumber yards, 3 hardware stores, 4 grocery stores, a drug store, 2 livery barns plus smaller shops like a millinery, and a population of at least 150 is now down to one business, the Brossart Garage, and a half a dozen families.







Court House Burned.

at Towner Early Tuesday Morning.

Records Destroyed.

THE RECORDS OF THE CLERK OF COURT, SUPERINTENDENT AND COUNTY COURT, WERE DESTROYED—FIRE DISCOVERED BY THE JANITOR.

The McHenry county court house at Towner, was destroyed by fire at an early hour Tuesday morning. The fire was first discovered by a man

behind the stairway in the hall, but the flames had gained such a headway that nothing could be done to stay their progress and ten minutes later the building was in full blaze.

Sheriff Jevnager and County Treasurer Wally were sleeping in the sheriff's quarters of the new jail building, and upon being awakened, hurried to the scene, but were unable to save anything but outside of a couple of typewriters and an automatic adding machine.

The records in the auditor's and treasurer's office were in fire proof vaults, and were but slightly damaged, but those in the clerk of court's, county superintendent's office and of the county court were destroyed.

The building itself burned to the ground.

The origin of the fire appears to be a mystery. The building and contents was insured for \$7000.

COUNTRY SCHOOLS IN BERWICK TOWNSHIP

Indebted to the following for information: Olena Larson, Mrs. Jennie Gustafson McKellip of Everett, Wash., Oscar Folden of Minot and Eva Kuhn.

One school was first located about three miles north from the Ole Sorenson farm. This school was called the Strand School. Anton Strand, an uncle to Olena Larson, was the closest neighbor.

According to Mrs. Jennie Gustafson McKellip of Everett, Washington, some of the pupils attending this school in 1897 were: Mabel and Emma Jorgenson; Christine, Henry and Lettie Hanson; Amelia and Albert Hermanson; Amelia, Olga and Melvin Paulson, Ida and Olena Sorenson; Jennie Gustafson & a couple of boys by the name of Taylor.

Olena Larson, who started school here in 1903, remembers her first teacher as being May Wiseman, who later married Albert Hansen, a gardener from Towner.

School would be in session for three months in the spring, and then again for two or three months in the fall. There weren't too many who finished all eight grades--some would quit after four to six years of school.

A few years later, the Strand school building was moved to near the Iver Iverson farm. From then on, the school was referred to as the Iverson School. Another way to pinpoint the location would be to say it was 1½ miles west from what is now the Pete Schell farm.

Oscar Folden of Minot wrote that one of the first teachers in this school was a Miss Inanda Gigstad. She filed on a homestead southwest of the Pete Schell farm and taught school while living on the homestead to prove her claim. Other teachers in the school were: Phil Stenseng, Minnie Klokko, A Miss Gerton, and a Miss Sophia Knutson from Wisconsin who later married Dr. E.O. Steeves. Dr. Steeves practiced medicine in Berwick at that time and later moved to Rugby. Then there was an Ida Halstengaard. She married Chris Fedje who was with the Fedje & Tweet General Store in Berwick.

Some of the pupils attending this school were: Jennie, Isabel, Oliver, and Harold Gustafson, Knute, Oliver and Carlis Iverson; Olga, Alvina and Ida Hermanson; Ellen, Oscar, Anne and George Folden; Alice and Mabel Carlson; Alma Fjarli; Olena and Henry Sorenson; Bessie Paulson, who later went on to high school to become a teacher. She taught in Berwick for several years. There were also Barney and Joe Huber, who lived on a farm owned by Thorvald Fylken. Ole Foldens also lived on this farm shortly after they were married. Leonard Bischoff now lives on the farm.

After bus routes to the school in Berwick were established, there didn't seem to be any further need for this country school, so the building was sold in 1914 to Ole Sorenson, who moved it to his farm where it became a kitchen for his house. Later, the Ole Sorenson farm became the Oscar Larson farm.

The third school was the Norway School located about an eighth of a mile from the Pete Haman farm.

Some of the teachers were: Christine Jorgenson, Marcella Krause, Susan Burns, Gabriel Tuchscherer, Winona Schiele, George Schafer. Clara Haman, Marion Haman, Stephena Haman and Minnie Olson. The last teacher was Helen Haman.

This writer can remember when she and her friend, Gladys Halseth, were visiting this school when George Schafer was teaching. Being former classmates and Gladys being a natural cut-up, she couldn't resist making faces at the pupils when George wasn't looking. After he had dismissed school for the day, he said he should have kept the kids in and thrown the visitors out.

Pupils attending this school included: the Larsons, (Olena went to all three schools in the township), Hamans, Burckhards, Wormsbeckers, Hansons, Kuntz, Fern Ellingson and the Brandons.

Eva Haman Kuhn, who went all eight years here, remembers the Christmas programs, in particular. They were the big events for the year. The school-house would be packed as people came from miles around.

Finally, there were so few pupils, it was cheaper to bus them into Berwick than run the school. John Jaeger bought the building and moved it to his farm for a garage.

BERWICK SCHOOL HISTORY

McHenry County's Twelfth School District

By Mylo Bryn

The date of the organization of the Norway School District No. 12 is uncertain, since the early records of the school district are missing and the records in the office of the McHenry Superintendent of Schools were destroyed in a fire which destroyed the Courthouse in 1905.

There was a schoolhouse on the townsite before 1896. John Koenig was one of the early clerks. School terms were held during the summer, until January, 1902, when the board approved a plan to hold school during the winter months.

Some of the early members of the Norway School District Board include William Kiester, A. K. Lee, George Hunter, Louis Ebell, John Fjarle, Iver Iverson, and James Lockhead.

There was agitation for a new school during the early part of 1910. An election was held to decide whether to post a bond for a new school. The bond was approved by a vote of seventy-one to thirty-three. However, petitions were being circulated for another election a few weeks after the first election.

The earliest records available indicate that the first high school graduate was Miss Madge Arnold who graduated in 1914. The high school will be closed at the close of the 1959-1960 school year. Oliver Finstad has been the principal since 1950. Mr. Finstad has been instrumental in making several improvements in the school. He also spark-plugged the establishment of the PTA chapter in Berwick. Clifford H. Cram, Richard V. Housh, Ludwig A. Waiver, L. B. Ness, Joyce Michaelson, S. Taylor, P. A. McArton, B. A. Ereckson, W. B. Schmidt, Edna M. Fylken, James Lockwood and Virgil Reetz were former principals.

As the result of an election held in June, 1959, the school district became a part of the Newport Special School District. The high school will be consolidated with the Towner High School in September, 1960.

The last Board of Education of the school district consisted of Clifford Knudson, president; John Jaeger, and Adam Kuhn, directors; Mrs. Eunice Sitter, clerk; and Wayne Holmes, treasurer. The faculty during the final year of high school included Oliver Finstad, principal; Robert Myhre, high school, Mrs. Lorraine Regan, Mrs. Eunice Sitter and Mrs. Vivian Kenney, grade school.

ADDITIONAL NOTES

Richard Kuhnenn, a retired machinist who has traveled widely to South America, Europe and Asia, and now lives in Portland, Oregon, sent us a most informative letter. He is a 1917 graduate.

Quoting from Dick Kuhnenn's letter:

"Starting with the 1913-14 term in high school, I lived with my married sister, Mrs. Clarence Taylor, about 4½ miles west of Berwick. (Clarence Taylor is a brother to Smith Taylor who was a professional wrestler as well as a teacher. He is a former principal of Berwick school.) I walked the 9 mile round trip, then my brother-in-law bid in a school bus route and I became a bus driver. (He had some exciting experiences as a bus driver.) During my final year, I worked in Fedje & Tweet store and lived in one of Berwick's two hotels".

For those of you who like a little bit of history, Clarence Taylor's father was Alex Taylor. Alex Taylor's father lived in Crawfordville, Indiana. He sold and delivered wood to Major General Lee Wallace who was the author of the book, Ben Hur.

Dick Kuhnenn's first principal was a Ralph Housch from Chicago who introduced basketball to Berwick High. For the next three years he had L. A. Waiver who maintained strict discipline and like he said, "You would expect that from a man whose initials spelled L.A.W."

He went on to say that Berwick had an outstanding basketball team losing only two or three games over a four year period. They played against high school teams, town teams and the State Normal School at Minot. Elmer Halseth remembers this team as including: Lyle Arnold, Leonard Gallagher, Ed LaFave, Walter and Orrin Oppen.

In Kuhnenn's graduating class of 1917 there were three others besides himself. They were: Esther Burr, Walter and Orrin Oppen.

Some of those graduating before him were: Ed and Ethel LaFave, Lyle Arnold, Jessie Torgerson, Leonard Gallagher, Lillian and Clara Ebel.

Some of his teachers were: Ida Christopherson, a Miss Kofoid, Florence Duncan and a lady who became Mrs. Chas. Blasing of Rugby. Years later the principals included a Miss Lura, Lyla Hoffine, Leonard Orvedal, and Harvey Headen.

Dick Kuhnenn married a Willow City girl, Miletta Schultz. Her sister, Ruth, was the wife of Dr. L. Serhus, formerly of Rugby.

The Kuhnenn's have no children.

Elmer Halseth graduated from Berwick High in 1922 and they had a good basketball team then too. They were so good, in fact, that in playing larger high schools they had to be careful not to get into a fight. A larger school does not relish being defeated by a smaller one. One time the Berwick team went by bobsled to Towner to play the Towner High team. Berwick was ahead by at least 20 points in the last quarter, then a fight erupted, so the Berwick coach told his team to get back in the bobsled and they drove back to Berwick without finishing the game. On his team were: Andrew Mitchell, Rochus Keller, Walter Ebel and Elmer and Bill Thorson.

Some of those who went to high school with Claude Oppen were: Lawrence Aubol, Johnny Rose, Joe Voeller and Elmer Halseth.

The last class to graduate from Berwick High School was in 1960 and they included: Marjorie Jundt, Gloria Walters, Anna Volk, Wallace Ebell and Kenny Schell.




